The 2015 Minnesota institute on Alcohol and Drug Studies (MAIADS) and Native American Prevention Program Sharing (NAPPS) Planning Committee is requesting proposals for presentations. The theme for the conferences is ***WTF?! (What's the Fix?!): Community and Culturally Responsive Solutions*** (see page 4). The presentation proposal should be postmarked no later than **June 15th, 2016**. Selected presenters will be notified no later than **June 25th, 2016**. The MAIADS/NAPPS Planning Committee screens proposals for determination of appropriate topic, time frame, and compatibility with the conference theme. Workshops with elders as presenters will be given priority.

Presenter Discounts and Benefits:

MAIADS offers a stipend for workshop presentations (\$175.00/workshop), mileage reimbursement (**roundtrip** - Less than 50 miles - \$0.00; 50-80 miles - \$20.00; 81-125 - \$40.00; 126-200 - \$60.00; 201-250 - \$80.00; 300-350 - \$100.00; over 350 miles - \$150.00), and lodging costs for one night, if required.

*****Please note***** MAIADS is unable to offer additional stipends and travel reimbursements if your presentation involves more than one presenter. ***You must register and pay for the conference separately if you plan to attend.***

Though you may choose to be present at the conference only during your workshop and to not register, **you are strongly encouraged to register for the entire conference**.
