The Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) is an agreement between FDLTCC, Minnesota State Colleges and Universities and the University of Minnesota. When completed in its entirety and documented on a student's transcript, the MnTC will transfer as a "package" to any MN State system school, the University of Minnesota and some private colleges. Students must fulfill the 10 goal areas and complete 40 liberal education credits while maintaining a 2.0 overall GPA. Courses with a superscript (i.e. GEOG 10208) satisfy more than one goal area; however, the credits are only counted once toward the 40 credit requirement.
