The Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) is an agreement between FDLTCC, Minnesota State Colleges and Universities and the University of Minnesota. When completed in its entirety and documented on a student's transcript, the MnTC will transfer as a "package" to any MN State system school, the University of Minnesota and some private colleges. Students must fulfill the 10 goal areas and complete 40 liberal education credits while maintaining a 2.0 overall GPA. Courses with a superscript (i.e. GEOG 1020<sup>8</sup>) satisfy more than one goal area; however, the credits are only counted once toward the 40 credit requirement. Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) courses with grades "A-D" transfer; however, a cumulative MnTC GPA of 2.0 is required. If the student's cumulative grade point average at the original institution is less than 2.0, no D grades for non-MnTC courses will be accepted in transfer from that school.

\*AMIN 1050: Anishinaabeg of Lake Superior is required for all degree seeking students starting Fall 2001.

**ASSOCIATE OF ARTS DEGREE REQUIREMENTS:**

Students need a total of 60 credits (which includes a minimum of 40 MnTC credits) and fulfillment of two Physical Education credits. The A.A. degree is primarily intended for students who plan to transfer to a four-year institution to complete a Bachelor's degree.

**In choosing courses, students should check their intended transfer institution for specific course and credit requirements.** Through careful selection of courses, students can enhance their preparation for a planned four-year major.
