Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) courses with grades "A-D" transfer; however, a cumulative MnTC GPA of 2.0 is required. If the student's cumulative grade point average at the original institution is less than 2.0, no D grades for non-MnTC courses will be accepted in transfer from that school.

*AMIN 1050: Anishinaabeg of Lake Superior is required for all degree seeking students starting Fall 2001.

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ASSOCIATE OF ARTS DEGREE REQUIREMENTS:

Students need a total of 60 credits (which includes a minimum of 40 MnTC credits) and fulfillment of two Physical Education credits. The A.A. degree is primarily intended for students who plan to transfer to a four-year institution to complete a Bachelor's degree.

In choosing courses, students should check their intended transfer institution for specific course and credit requirements. Through careful selection of courses, students can enhance their preparation for a planned four-year major.
