Get into the job market:

- New MN guidelines enable you to begin your career with an associate degree. Work with your advisor to learn more about future possibilities. Median wages in MN with a bachelor's degree:
 - Elementary Education Teachers: \$61,423 (projected 10-year openings 2018-2028: 18,844)
 - Instructional coordinators: \$77,818
- Median wages in MN with a doctoral degree:
 - Education administrators, kindergarten through secondary: \$115,313
