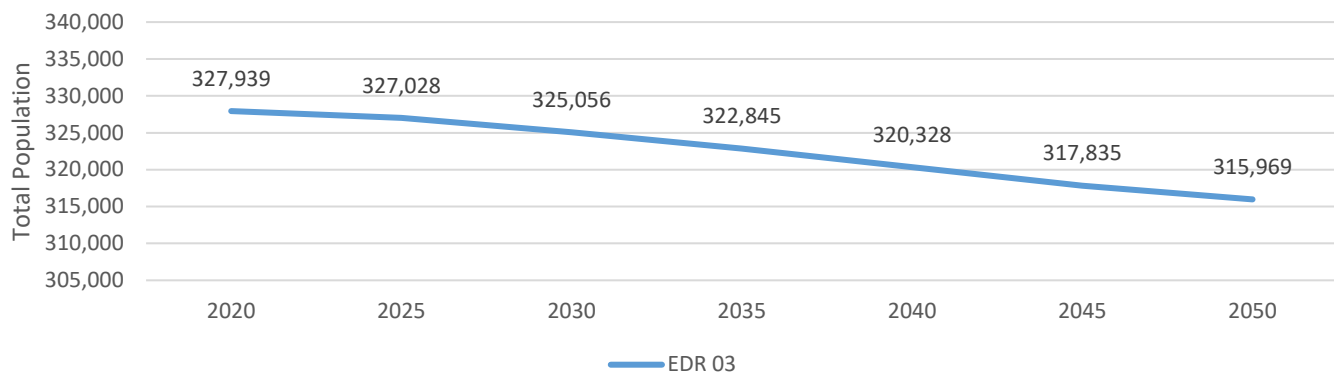

MN Region 03 - Arrowhead, 30-Year Population Projection, 2020-2050

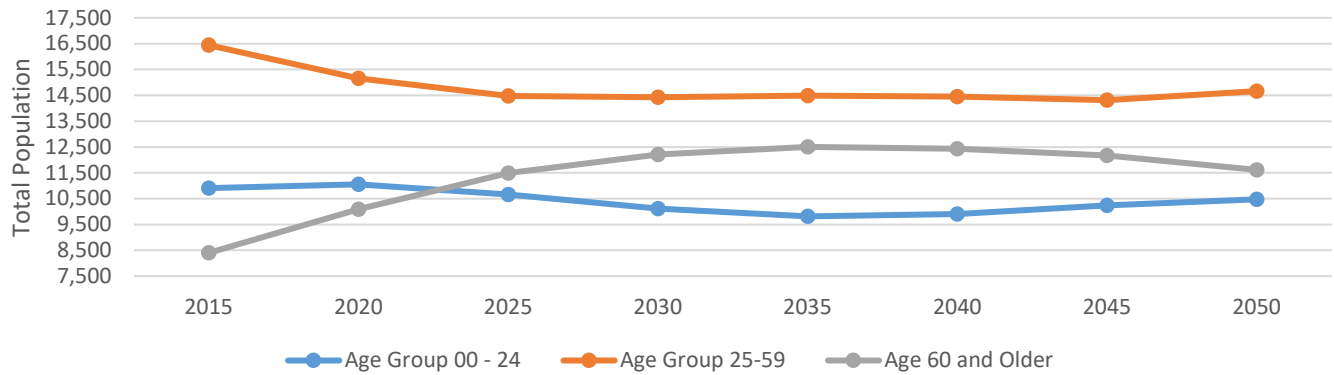

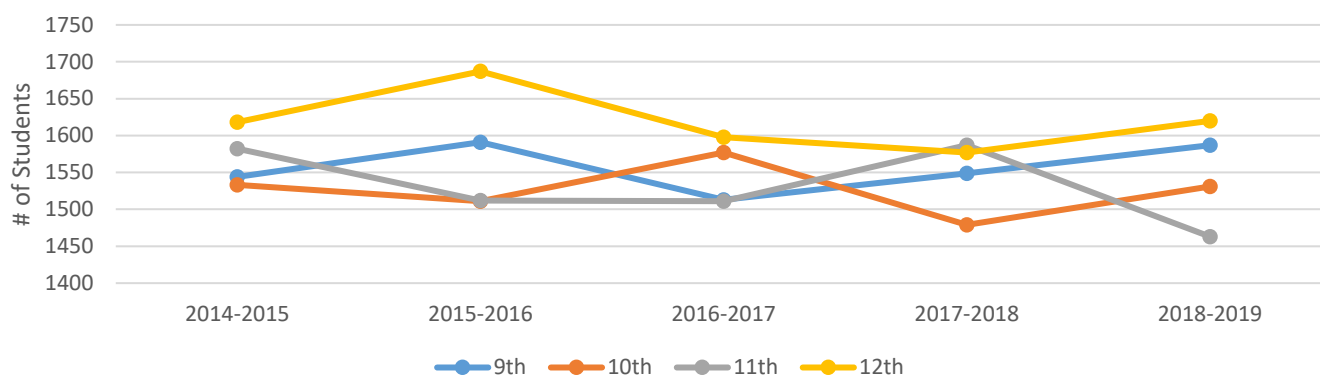

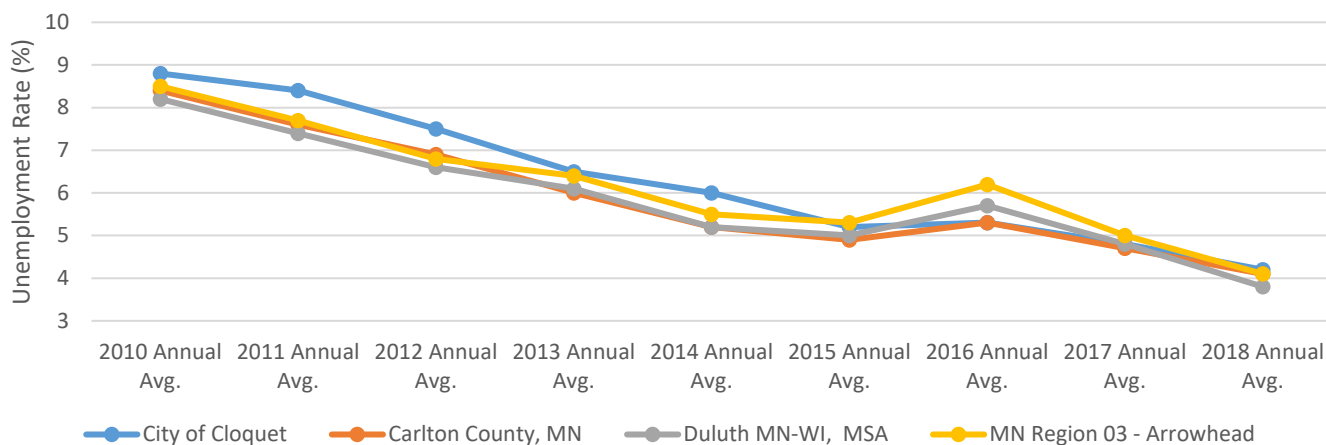
Area School District Enrollment Trends by Grade

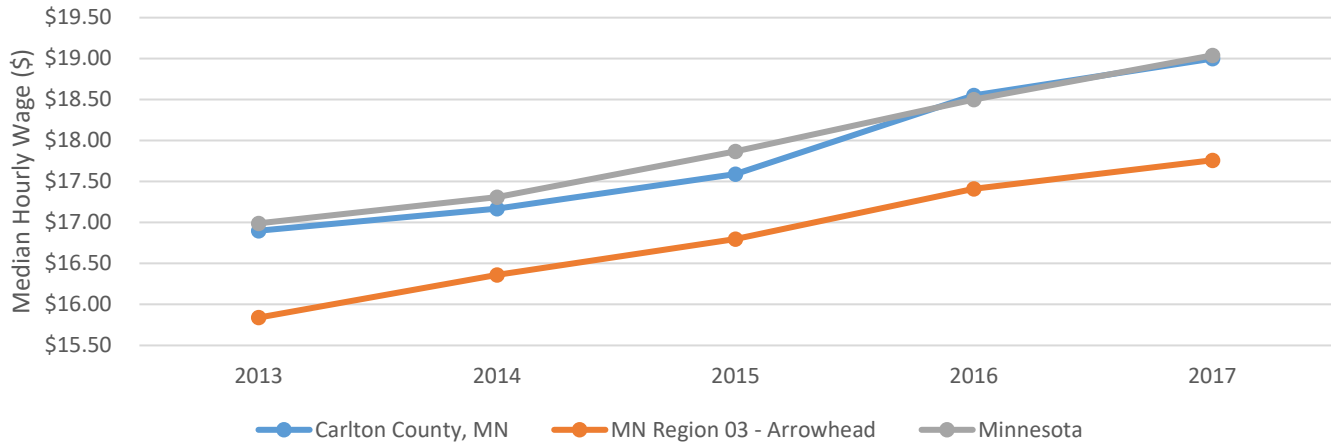

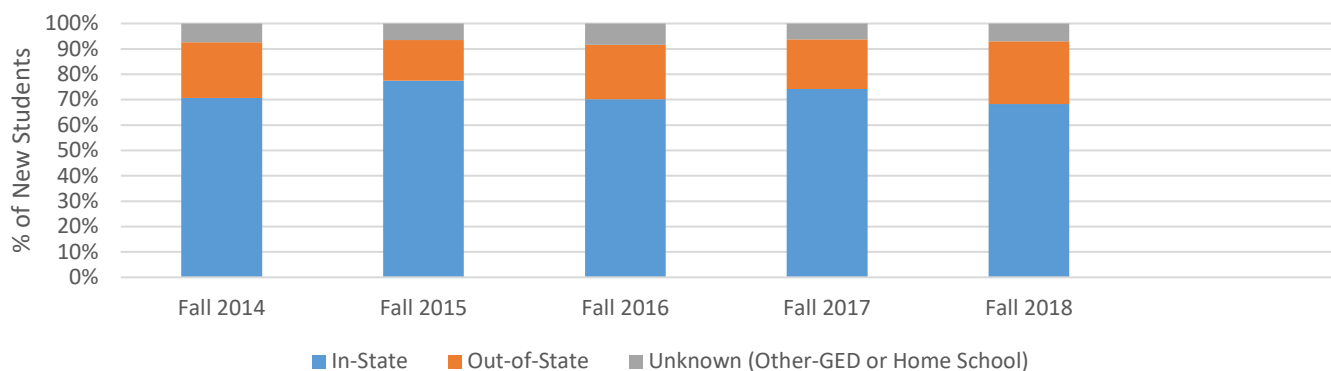

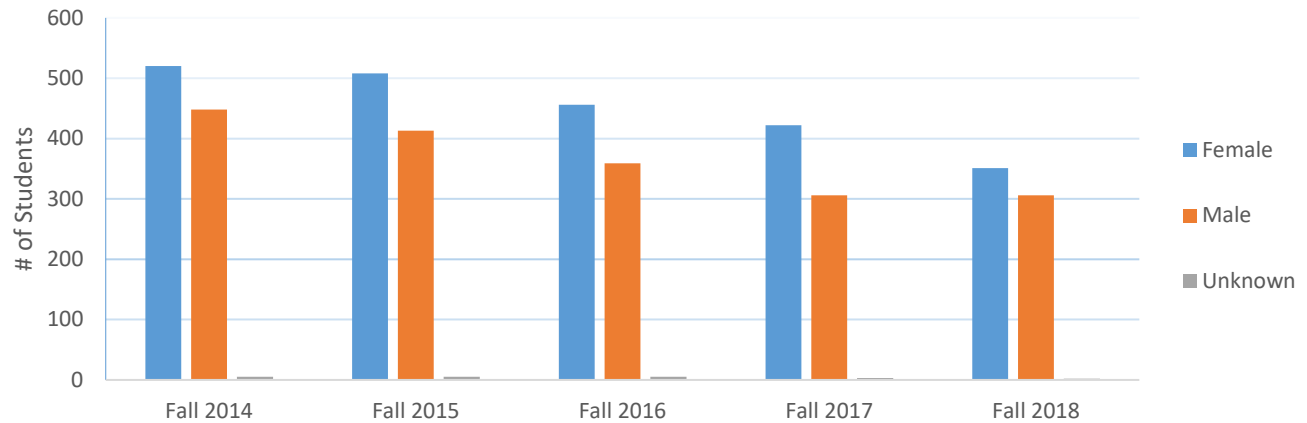

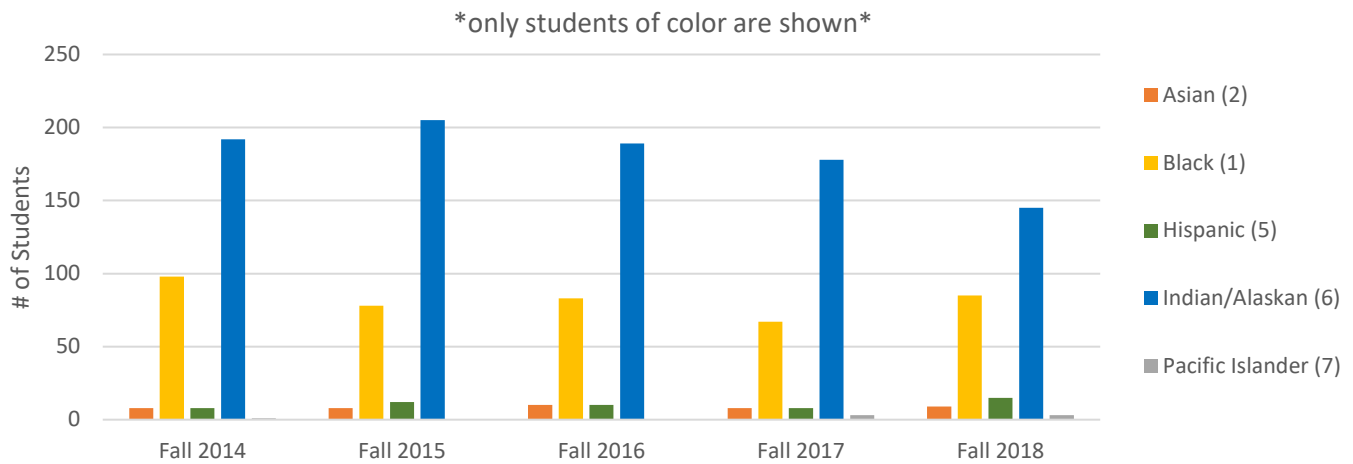

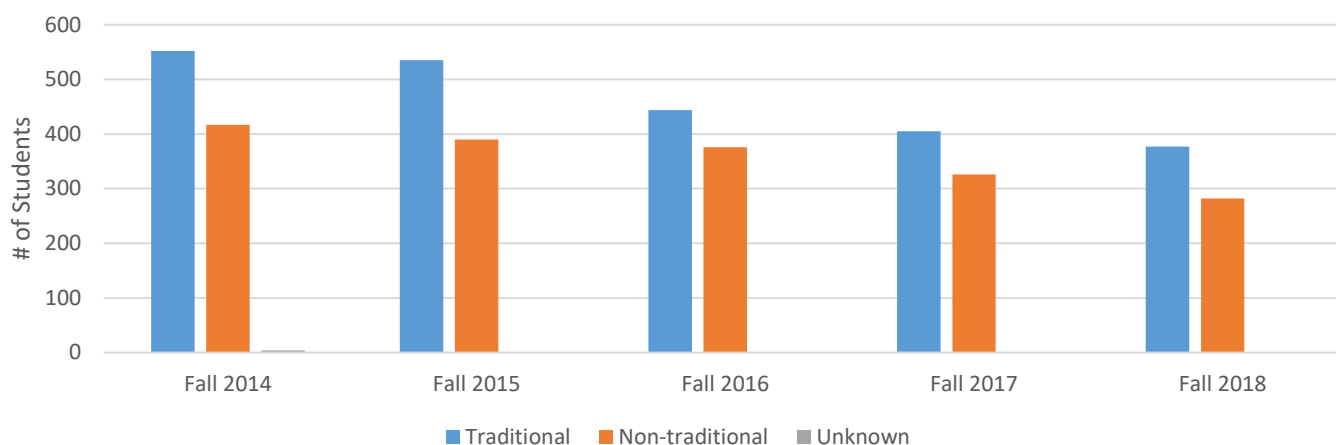

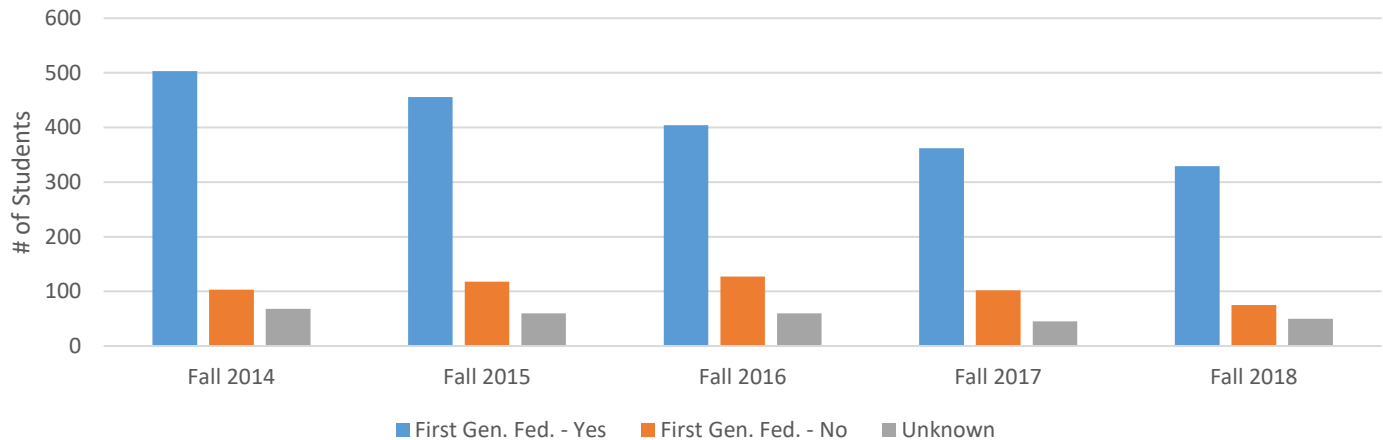

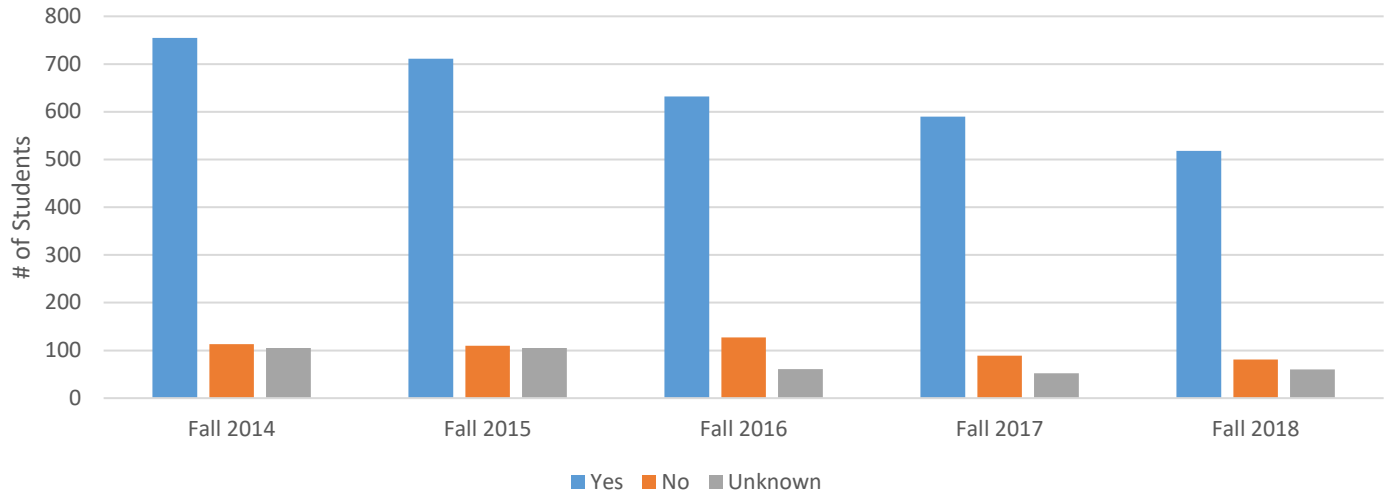

Undergraduate Enrollment by Fiscal Year

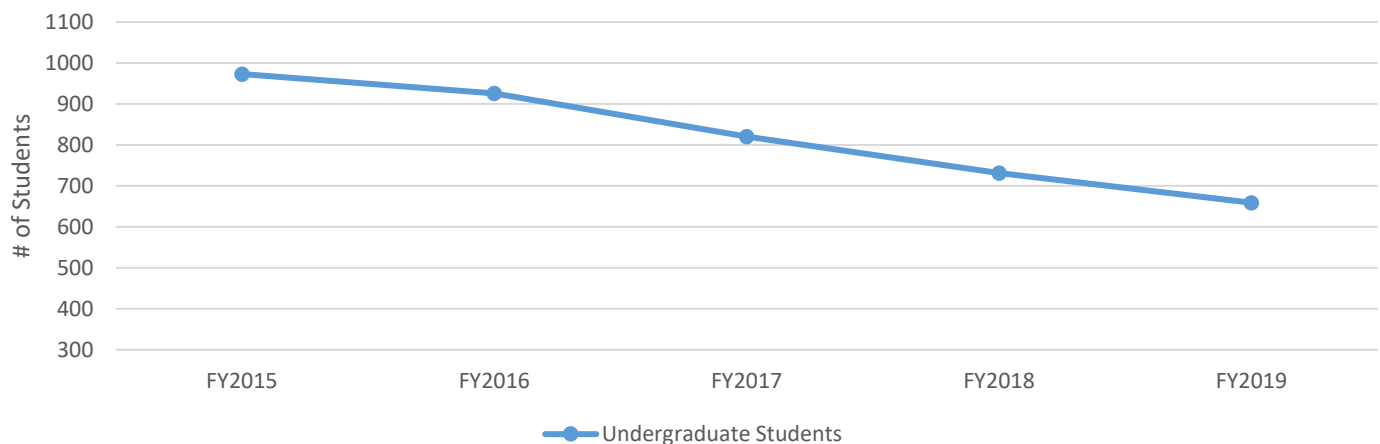

Undergraduate Enrollment by Semester – Fall

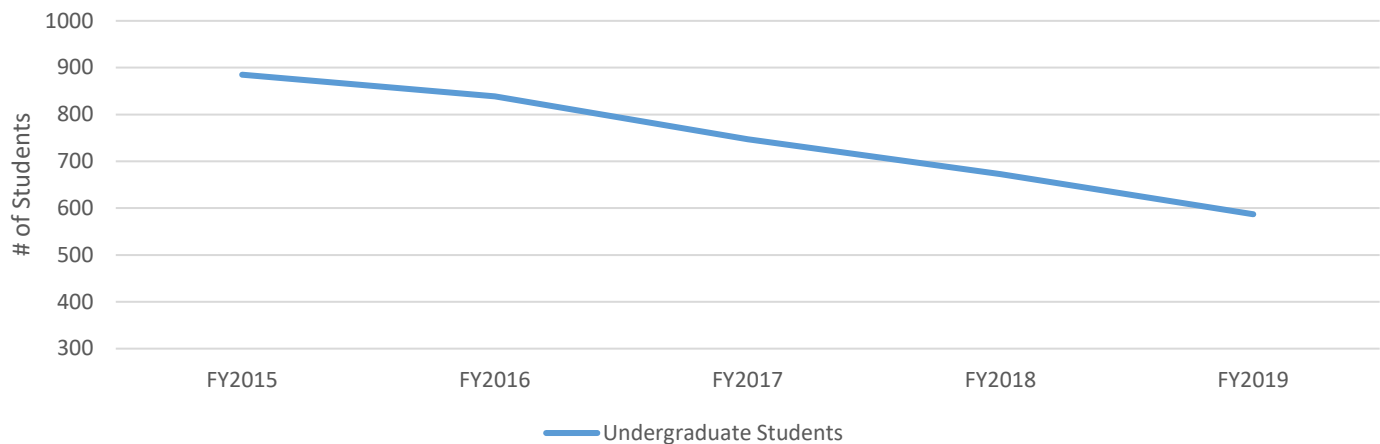

Undergraduate Enrollment by Semester – Spring

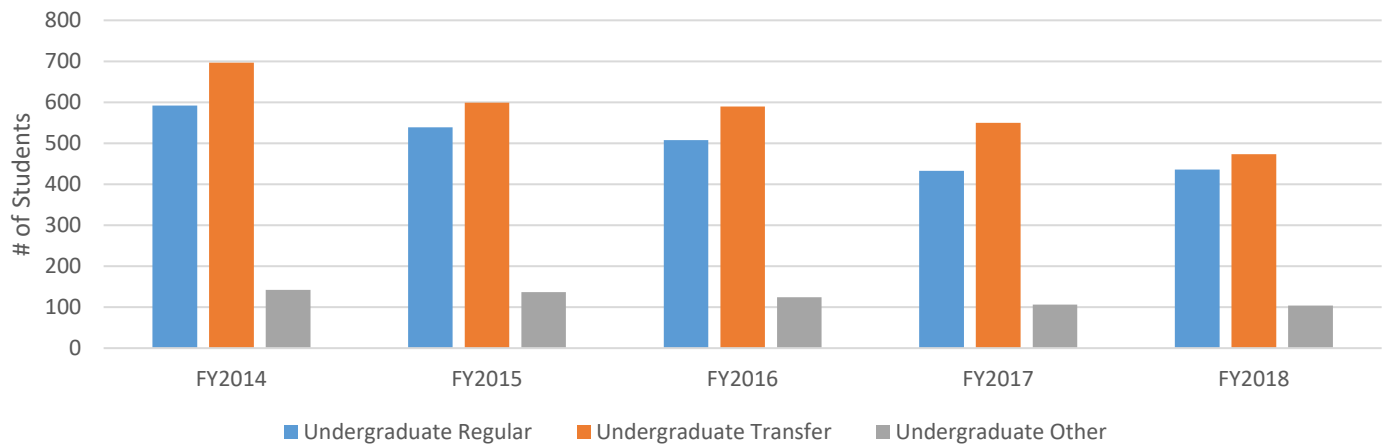

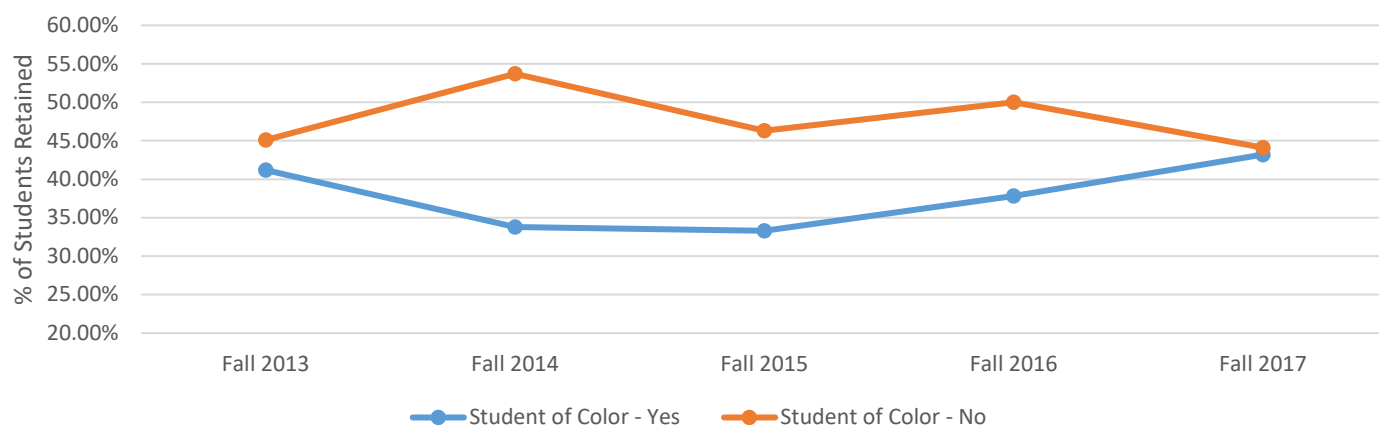

2nd Fall Retention (Full-time and Part-time) by Student of Color

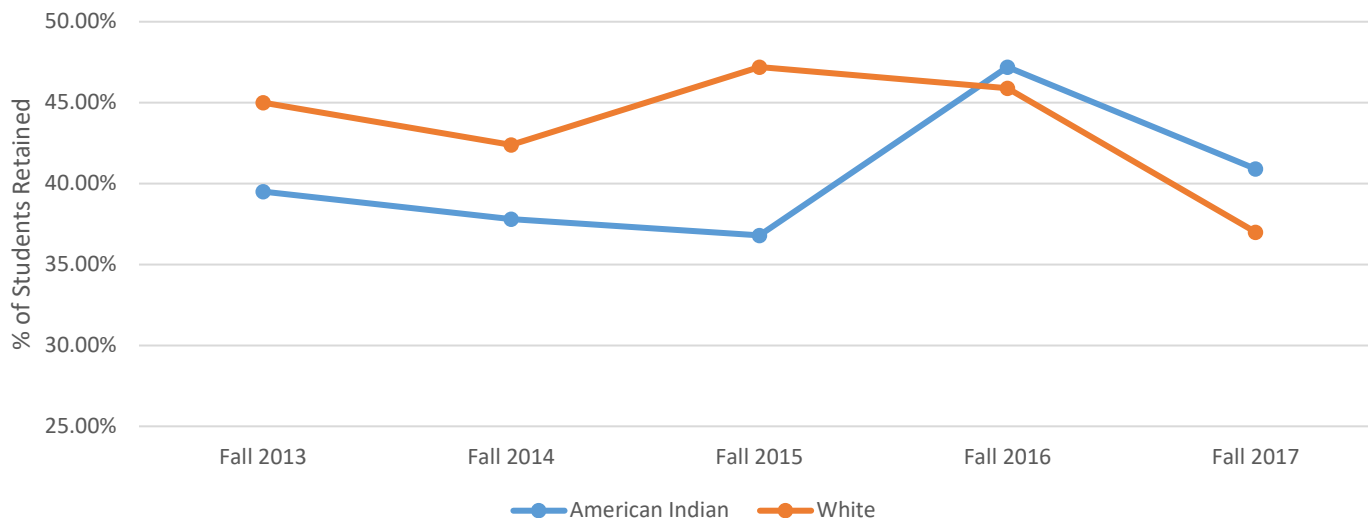

2nd Fall Retention (Full-time and Part-time) by American Indian Race/Ethnicity

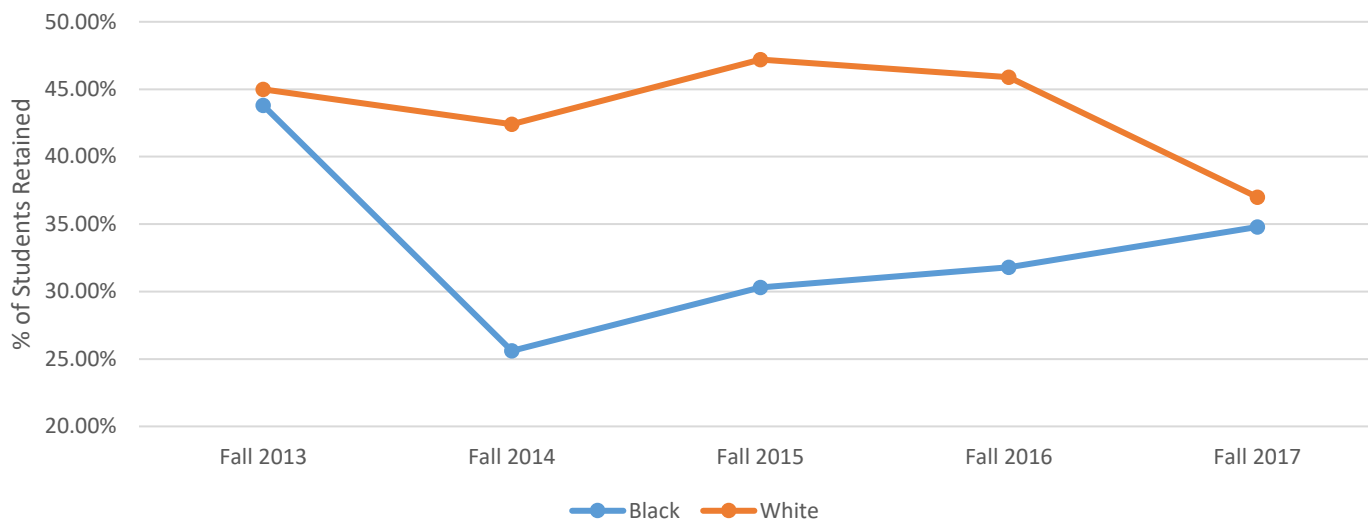

2nd Fall Retention (Full-time and Part-time) by Black Race/Ethnicity

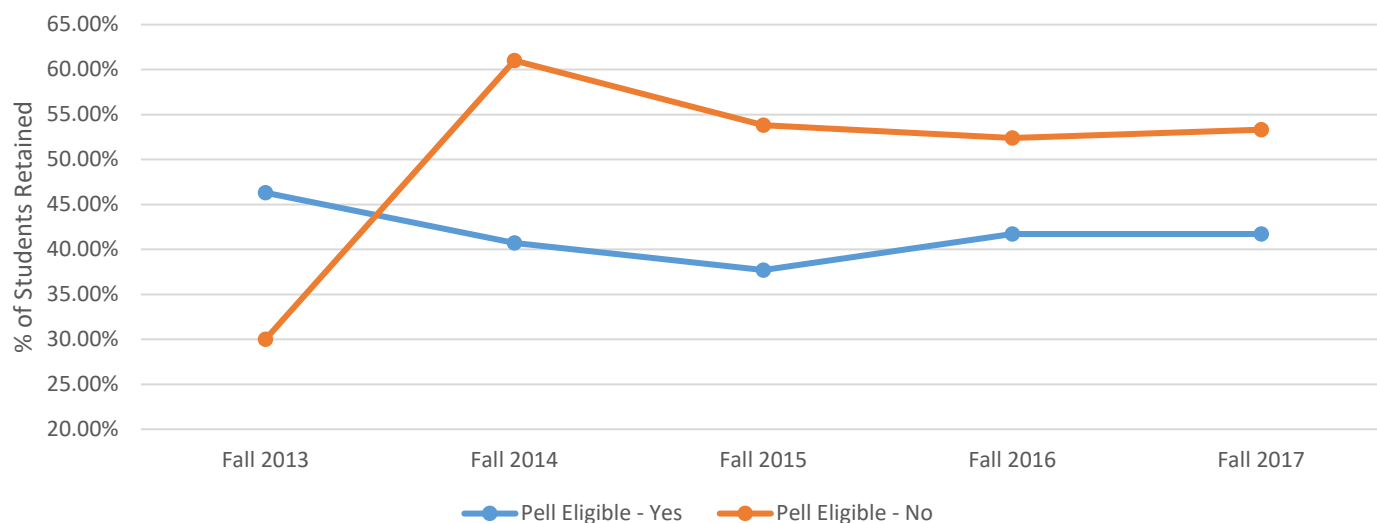

2nd Fall Retention (Full-time and Part-time) by Pell Eligible

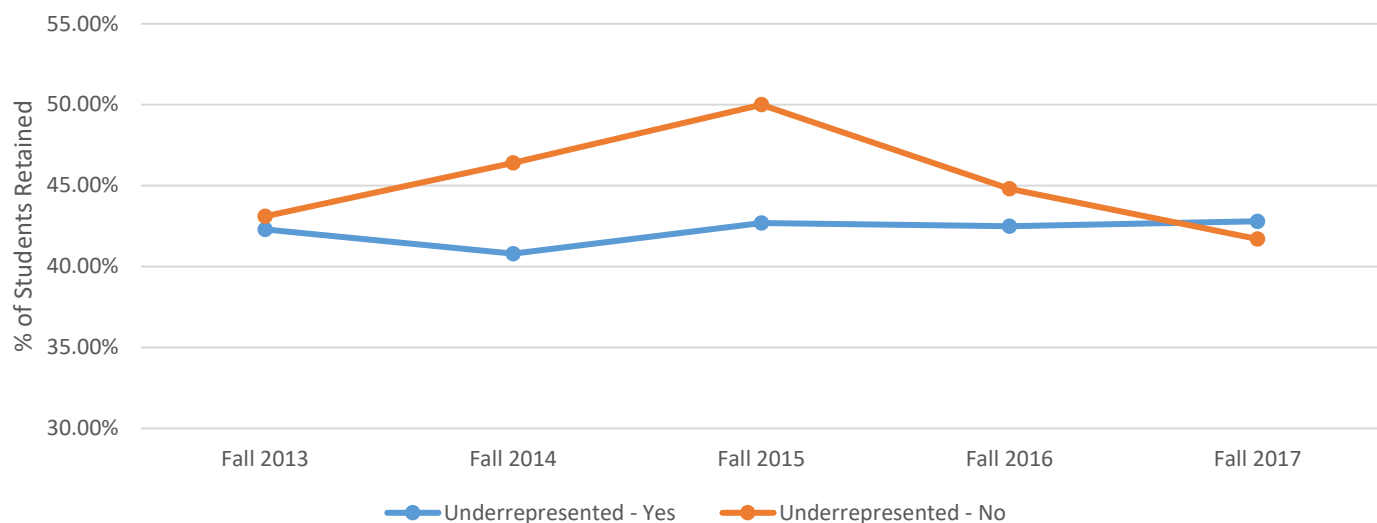

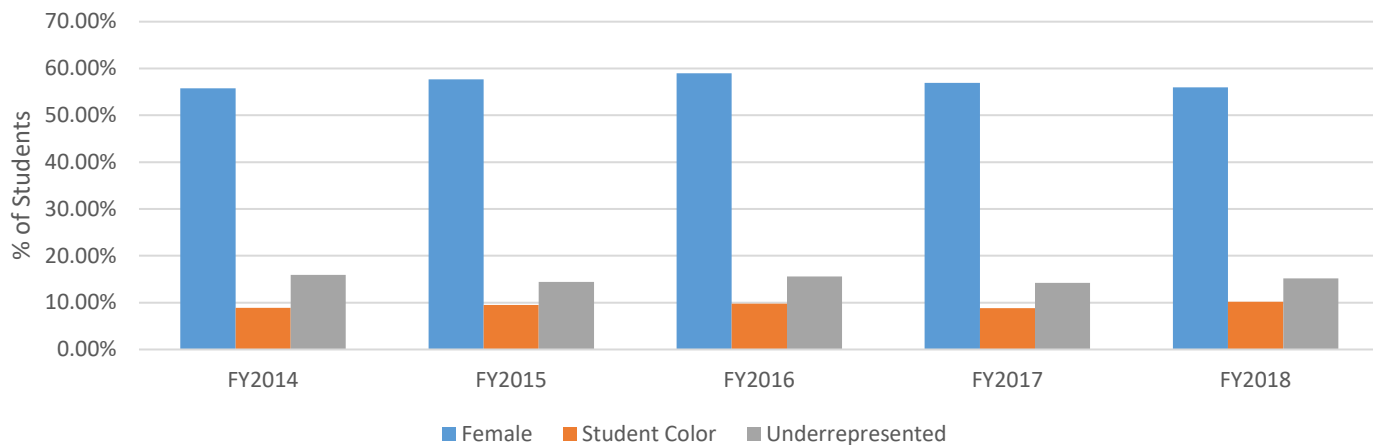

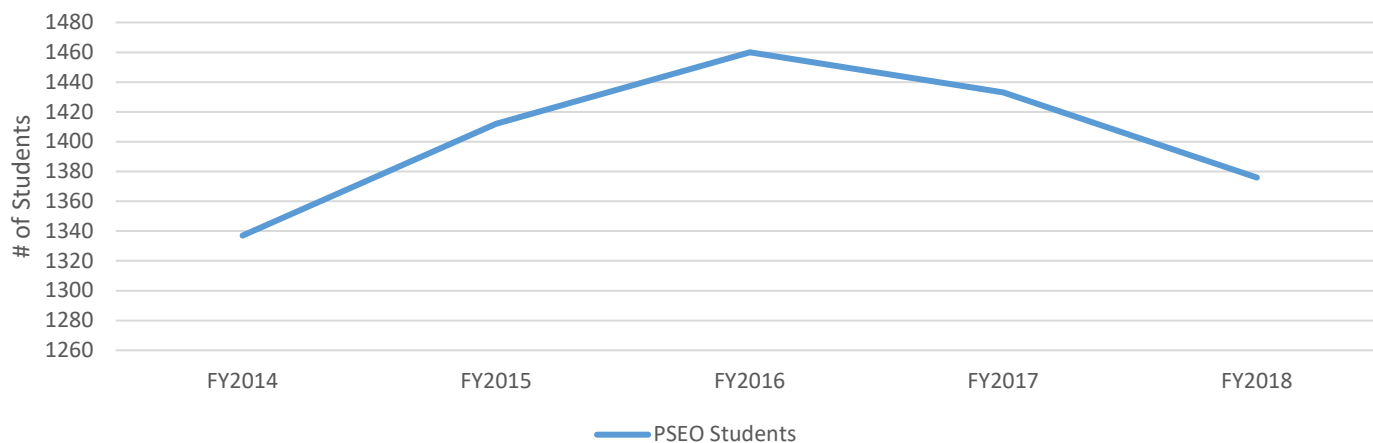

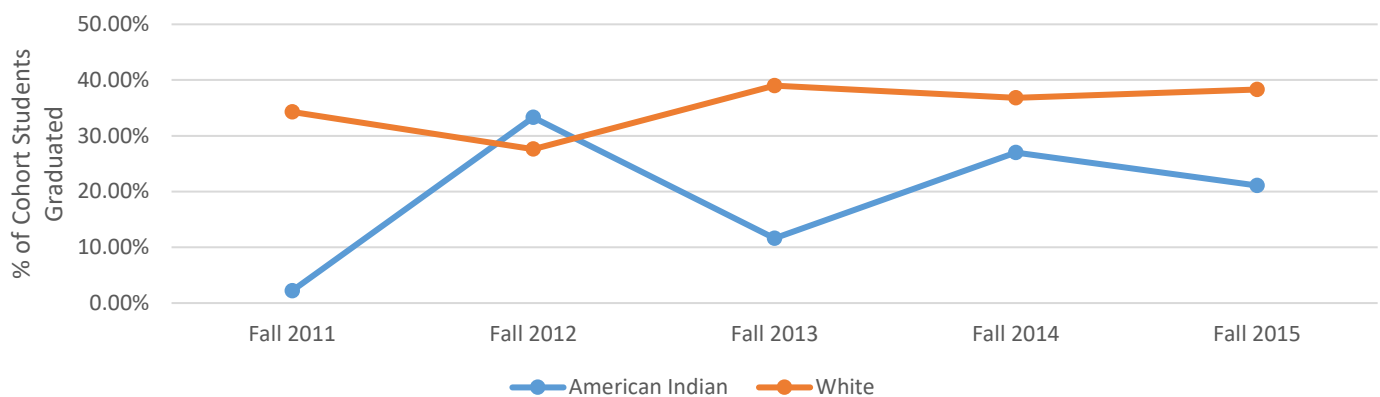

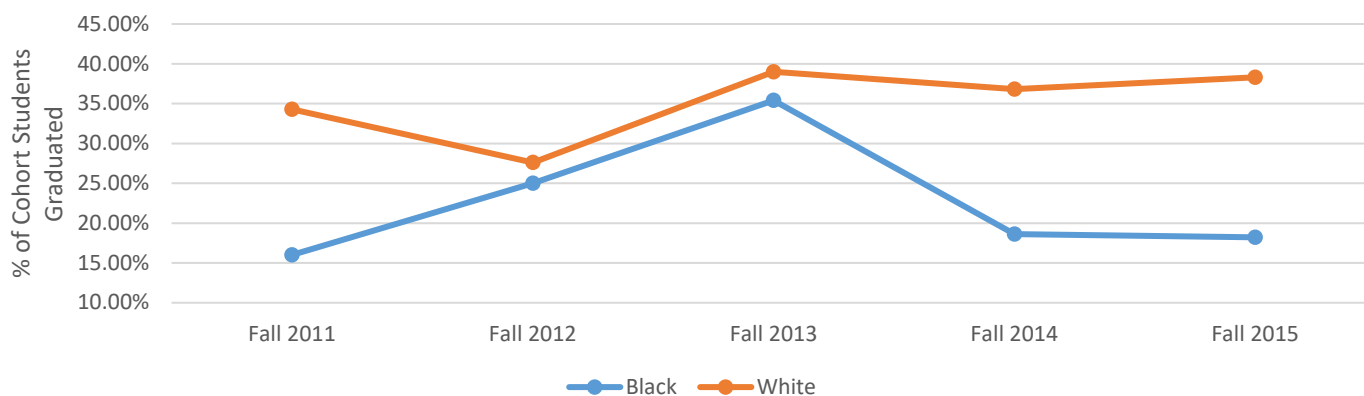
