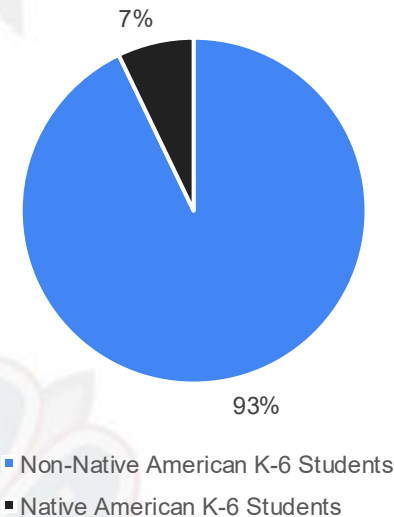
- Opportunity for engagement:

2. Assist in preparing future educators with curriculum that is relevant to culture and academic needs.

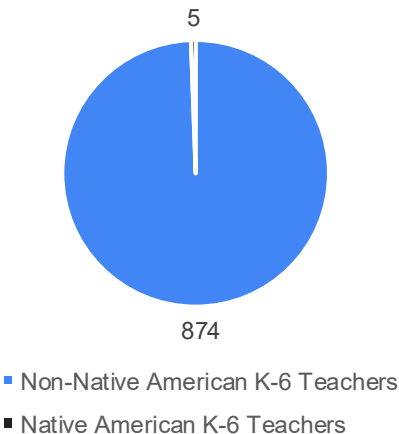
- All courses taught in the Education program have cultural standards implemented into them.
- Almost all of the courses are online courses.
- In person courses (suggested by students).
- Students complete 158 hours of field experience BEFORE student teaching.
- Student Teaching: 14 Weeks

Saint Louis County K-6 Student Headcount (School Year 2023-2024)

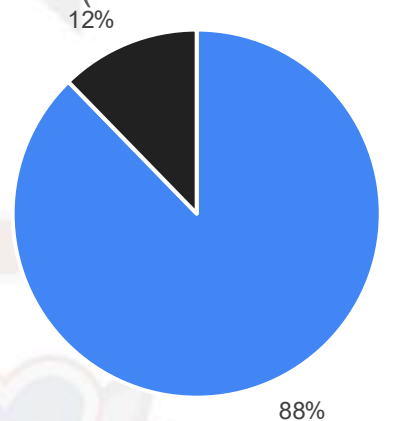


Public School Teaching FTE K-6 Saint Louis County (School Year 2023-2024)



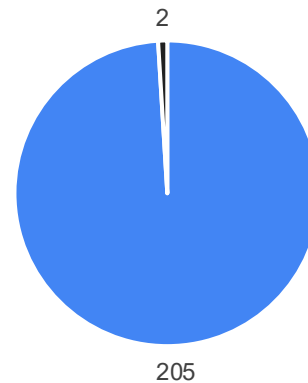
Carlton county schools

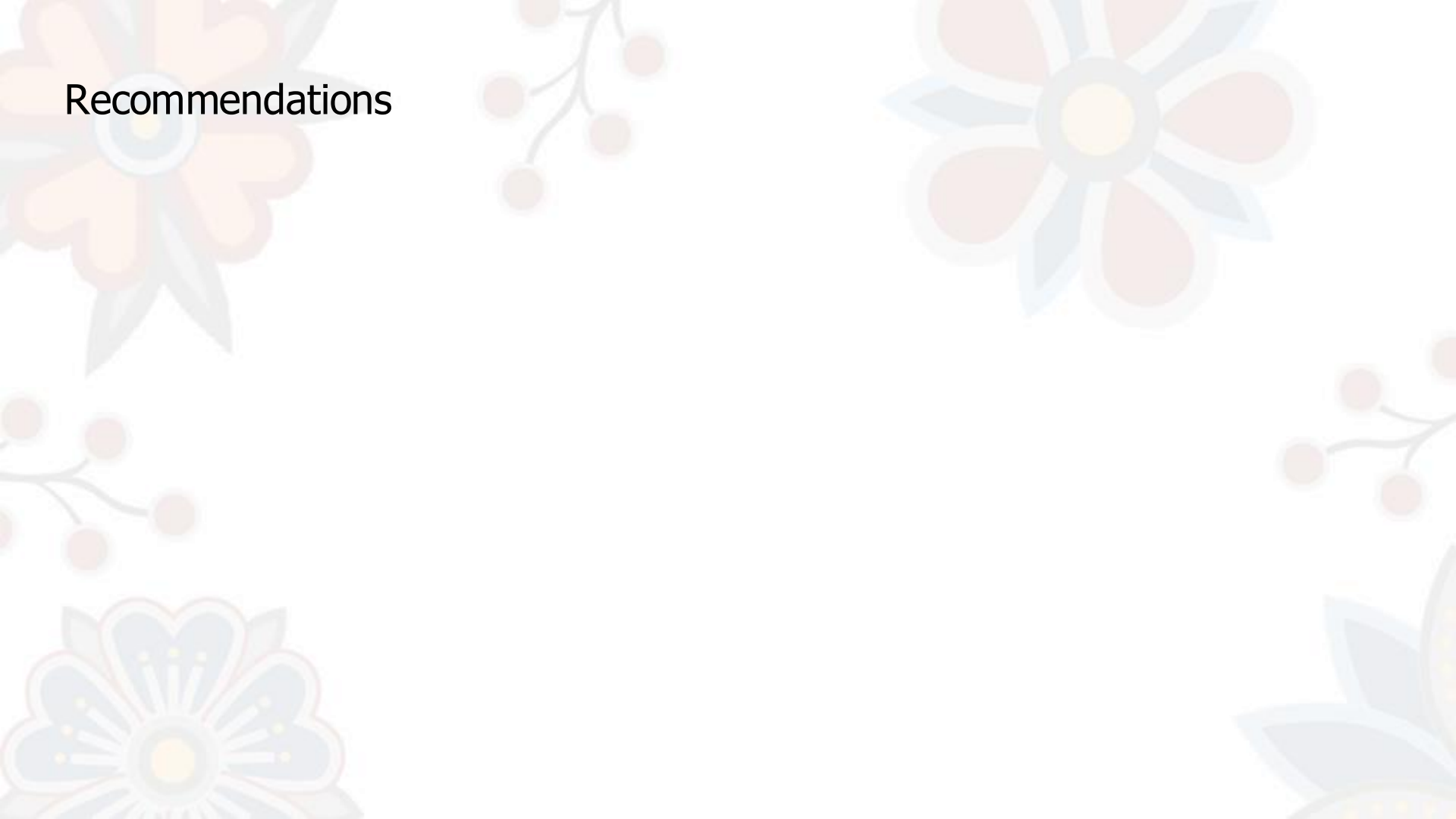
Recommendations:

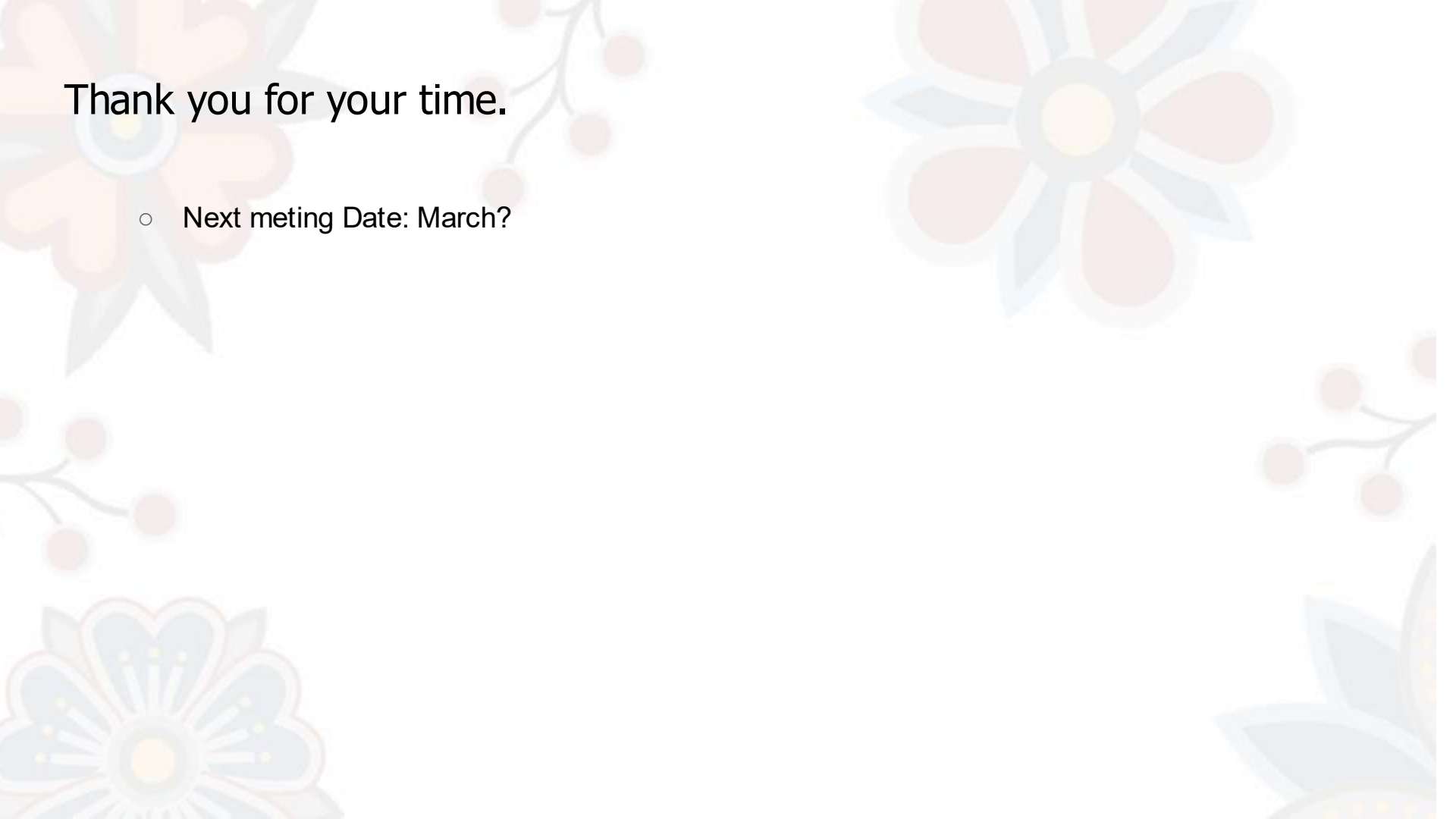
- Choose 1 day to visit local schools to talk with the para-professionals to talk about the Education program opportunities.
